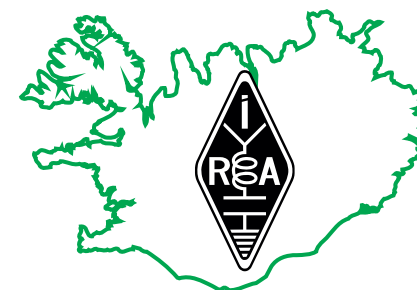


### Iceland on Digimodes Award

2. The Award is issued for contacting or receiving Icelandic amateur radio stations on digital modes.
3. There are no band or time limitations.
4. Requirements:  
Contact at least two Icelandic radio amateur stations on Digimodes  
**Please Note: Contacts with stations that are /TF or TF/ are not valid for this award.**
5. Contacts do not have to be confirmed but a list showing all QSO details, like station worked, day, month, year, time, band, mode and report must be submitted.
6. First award issued to each DXCC entity will be endorsed as such and single mode achievements will be endorsed upon request.
7. Fee for the Iceland on Digimodes Award is 8 IRC's, 5.00 US dollars or 5.00 EUR.

## The Icelandic Radio Amateurs Award

### General:

1. The award is available to licensed radio amateurs and SWL's outside TF.  
**Contacts with stations that are /TF or TF/ are not valid for this award.**
2. There is no time limit to the QSO's.
3. Certified photocopies of the QSL cards must be submitted to the sponsor together with a list of the complete log entries for the contacts.  
**Do not send the cards.**
4. All contacts must be made from the same call area or where no call area exist, from the same country.
5. The fee for the award is 8 IRC's, 5.00 USD or 5.00 EUR.

## Iceland on Six Meters Award

1. The award is available to all licensed radio amateurs and SWL's.
2. The Award is issued for contacting or hearing Icelandic amateur radio stations on six meters (50MHz).
3. There are no mode limitations.
4. **Requirements:**  
Contact at least two Icelandic radio amateur stations on six meters (50MHz).  
**Please Note: Contacts with stations that are /TF or TF/ are not valid for this award.**
5. Contacts do not have to be confirmed but a list showing all QSO details, like station worked, day, month, year, time, band, mode and report must be submitted.
6. First award issued to each DXCC entity will be endorsed as such and single mode achievements will be endorsed upon request.
7. Fee for the ICELAND ON SIX METERS AWARD is 8 IRC's, 5.00 US dollars or 5.00 EUR.

The award is printed for each applicant on a 110 g/m<sup>2</sup> 297 X 210 mm special Ink Jet paper in multicolors. The award was first issued in July 1998.



### I.R.A. Jota Award

1. The award is available to all licensed radio amateurs and SWL's.
2. The award is issued for contacting or hearing Icelandic JOTA amateur radio stations in co-operation with Icelandic Radio Scouts.
3. There is no time, band or mode limit on QSO's.
4. **Requirements:**  
Contact at least two JOTA Icelandic amateur radio stations.  
**Please note: Contacts with stations that are /TF or TF/ are not valid for this award.**
5. Contacts do not have to be confirmed but a list showing all QSO details like stations worked, day, month, year, time, band, mode and report must be submitted.
6. First Award issued to each DXCC entity will be endorsed as such and single mode achievements will be endorsed upon request.
7. Fee for "IRA JOTA AWARD" is 8 IRC's, 5.00 US dollars or 5.00 EUR.

The award is printed for each applicant on a 110 g/m<sup>2</sup> 297X210 mm special ink Jet paper in multicolor. The award was first issued in October 2001.



### I.R.A. Zone 40 Award

1. The award is available to all licensed radio amateurs and SWL's.
2. There is no time limit on QSO's.
3. There are no band limitations, but all QSO's must be in the same mode to achieve the award, i.e. 2XCW, 2XSSB or 2XRTTY etc. single band achievements can also be endorsed upon request.
4. **Requirements:**  
Confirmed contacts with each of the following DXCC entities located in CQ-Zone 40: Iceland (TF), Greenland (OX), Jan Mayen (JX), Svalbard (JW) and Franz Josef Land (R1FJ).  
DX-stations: One confirmed contact with each country (A total of 5QSO's)  
EU-stations: Same as DX, except QSO's are stipulated with three different TF-stations (A total of 7 QSO's).  
TF-stations: Same as for DX, except QSO's are stipulated with five different TF-stations (A total of 9 QSO's).  
**Please note: Contacts with stations /TF or TF/, /OX or OX/ etc. are not valid for this award.**
5. A GCR list, verified by two licensed radio amateurs or local club officials must be submitted. The list must show: Stations worked, date, year, time, band, report and mode. IRA-Awards manager reserves the right to ask for submittance of QSL's.
6. First award issued to a DXCC entity will be endorsed as such.
7. Fee for the IRA ZONE-40 AWARD is 8 IRC's, 5.00 USD or 5.00 EUR.

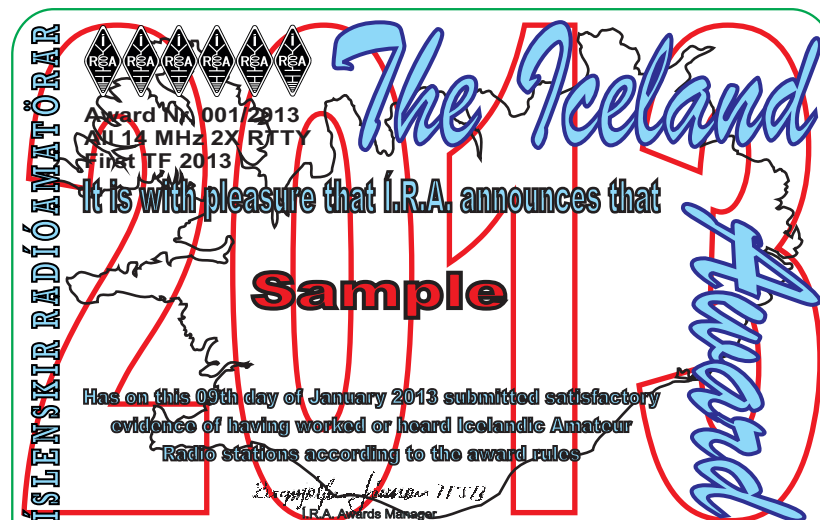
The award is printed for each applicant on a 110 g/m<sup>2</sup> 297 X 210 mm special Ink Jet paper in multicolors. The award was first issued in April 1994.



### Worked All Nordic Countries Award

1. The award is available to all licensed radio amateurs and SWL's.
2. There is no time limit on QSO's.
3. There are no band limitations, but all QSO's must be in the same mode to achieve the award, i.e. 2XCW or 2XSSB or 2XRTTY etc. single band achievement can also be endorsed upon request.
4. The award is issued in three classes: CLASS-A, CLASS-B and CLASS-C.
5. **Requirements:**  
Confirmed contacts with the following Nordic DXCC entities according to the rules. JW-SWALBARD, JX-JAN MAYEN, LA-NORWAY, OH-FINLAND, OH0-ALAND ISLANDS, OJ0-MARKETREEF, OX-GREENLAND, OY-FAROE ISLANDS, OZ DENMARK, SM-SWEDEN and TF-ICELAND.  
**ONE CONFIRMED CONTACT WITH ICELAND IS MANDATORY IN ALL CLASSES.**  
CLASS-A: One confirmed contact with each of the eleven countries.  
CLASS-B: One confirmed contact with eight of the countries and thereof two in CQ ZONE 40.  
CLASS-C: One confirmed contact with five of the countries and thereof one in CQ ZONE 40.  
**Please note: Contacts with stations /TF or TF/ or /OH0 or OH0/ etc. are not valid for this award except for OJ0.**
6. A GCR list, verified by two licensed radio amateurs or local club officials must be submitted. The list must show: Stations worked, date, year, time, band, report and mode. ÍRA-Awards Manager reserves the right to ask for submittance of QSL's.
7. First award issued to a DXCC entity will be endorsed as such.
8. Fee for the NORDIC COUNTRIES AWARD is 8 IRC's, 5.00 US Dollars og 5.00 EUR.

The award is printed for each applicant on a 110 g/m<sup>2</sup> 297X210 mm special ink Jet paper in multicolor. The award was first issued in June 1994.



### The Iceland Award

1. The Award is available to all licensed radio amateurs and SWL's.
2. The Award is issued for contacting or hearing Icelandic amateur radio stations within one calendar year, i.e. from 00.00 hours on January 1st to 23.59 hours on December 31st, and can therefor be applied for every year provided that the necessary contacts are made.
3. There are no band or mode limitations.
4. **Requirements:**  
Amateurs outside Iceland: Contact at least two Icelandic amateur radio stations.  
Icelandic Amateurs: Contact at least four Icelandic amateur radio stations.  
**Please note: Contacts with stations which are /TF or TF/ are not valid for this Award.**
5. Contacts do not have to be confirmed but a list showing all QSO details like stations worked, day, month, year, time, band, mode and report must be submitted.
6. First Award issued to a DXCC entity each year will be endorsed as such and single band/mode achievement will be endorsed upon request.
7. The starting year for the Award was 1995.
8. Applications much have reached the Award Manager before the end of the year after the application year, that is, for example, applications for 2013 must have reached the Award manager before the end of the year 2014.
9. Fee for "THE ICELAND AWARD" is 8 IRC's, 5.00 US dollars or 5.00 EUR.

The award is printed for each applicant on a 110 g/m<sup>2</sup> 297 X 210 mm Special Ink Jet paper in multi colors. The award was first issued in May 1995. From the year 2013 the Award will have the same look except that the year will change. The sample shown is for 2013.
